# In the Spotlight...

# Penticton Tune-Agers Choir and Orchestra celebrate their 50th anniversary—50 Years Young

It was the winter of 1969-70, fifty years ago. Seniors in Penticton had started to take advantage of a new drop-in centre at the hall in **St. Saviours Anglican Church**, and local musician **Helene Scott** had been asked if she would come and sing for them once a week. She soon decided to ask her audience to participate, to bring instruments if they played, or to join her in singing, and so the Tune-Agers were born. The group quickly grew into a combined choir and orchestra which has continued to this day, offering concerts twice a year to share their love of music with others.

In the early years, the **Tune-Agers** did a lot of travelling, touring across Canada and as far away as

Hawaii and England, sharing music and also sharing the message that seniors can keep learning and enjoying life. They cut three records—*Happy Days, Autumn Days,* and *Sentimental Journey*—and *Great Day,* an audiocassette (remember those?), copies of which were purchased by their audiences as they travelled and performed.

Helene continued to be their leader for 30 years. She was succeeded by **Patti Craig**, who was their conductor until the spring of 2011. Both Helene and Patti shared not only their considerable musical talents with the group, but also their deep love of music. This is what still shows today when the Tune-Agers perform; they spread this enjoyment through the audience.

Since 2011, there have been a few different conductors. **Gerald Nadeau** who was also leading the **Penticton Concert Band** at the time, was conductor from September 2011 until the spring of 2013. **Gordon Dawson** took over from Gerald and continued until the end of 2016. **Annabelle Redman** stepped in to conduct the choir in January 2017 and **Nick Kelly** became orchestra conductor in the spring of that year. Nick has been director of the whole group since September 2017, and he is looking forward, along with all of the choir and orchestra, to next



year, 2020, when the Tune-Agers will be celebrating 50 years of musicmaking together.

# In the Spotlight...

### Richmond Singers Ensemble celebrate their 30th anniversary

The **Richmond Singers Ensemble** is a group (maximum 18) of women who are members of the **Richmond Singers** (55 singers). The Ensemble was started 30 years ago to answer requests from the community which could not be filled by the larger choir. That is still the case today. The Ensemble averages about 35 singouts (mostly daytime) a year at local care facilities, seniors' groups and some special events. Currently 13 of our members are also active with the Richmond Singers, the other 3 have retired from the big choir.

We are very much part of the Richmond Singers although we operate independently: we have no director, select our own repertoire and arrange our own schedule. Our "mother choir" looks after the administration including finances for music, costumes and accompanist's fee. We are not a money making group although our activities in the community help validate grant applications. We accept an honorarium if offered. Each member of the group does one of those little jobs needed in any organization: emceeing our singouts, taking care of our music, booking our singouts, etc. Our singouts usually consist of about ½ hr performance, a 10-15 minute singalong and then a couple more songs from the Ensemble. We have 3 programs; Fall, Christmas and Spring, featuring a variety of music: jazz, swinging golden oldies, spirituals, unusual arrangements of familiar pieces. Our songs are 2 or 3 part although we do stretch to an occasional 4 part number. Some are relatively simple and others quite challenging. During the singalong we spread out among the audience, passing out our songbooks and small rhythm instruments and singing along while one of us leads the group.

Our weekly rehearsals are cooperative and are held at a local church to which we make a small donation. We have a few members with a musical education background who guide us through tricky rhythms and crunchy harmonies. All of us feel comfortable to ask for help when we have trouble with a particular spot. We sit in a circle.

Our venues are all different and circumstances often change during our performance. Sometimes our performances do, too. We try to be flexible and meet requests from the facilities. Many venues are HOT, the space for us to stand usually is tight and the piano may or may not be in good working order. We encourage our audiences to sing or clap along if they know the song. It is gratifying to see someone become involved. This involvement can range from singing along with a huge smile to simply moving one foot in time to the music. The connection with the audience as we share the joy of music inspires all of us to continue this major volunteer commitment.

We plan to celebrate our 30 year anniversary with a Saturday afternoon concert at **Gilmore Park United Church** in Richmond on **April 4, 2020**. Please join us if you can.
